This is an *Actinotus helianthi* or Flannel flower seedling.

There are other seedlings coming up. We are still planting seed and doing some Flannel flower cuttings.

We need round pots 11.5cm across and 9cm high and pots 9cm by 7.5cm by 10cm high. We also need empty 2ltr cordial bottles and large 4ltr ice cream containers with lids.
