Is a small spreading shrub less than 1 m tall. The flowers are mauve with five petals and 10 erect stamens which are hairy on top. Leaves are linear and crowded. It's is in flower now. It is a species characteristic of Eastern Suburbs Banksia Scrub

The Hospital Picnic Grounds



Wander down behind the Manly Hospital buildings, past the storage tanks for the medical gases, and you will come upon a set of steps leading down to an Art Deco pavement which leads down through a cutting to this scene, where it eventually disappears beneath the soils. There is little documentary evidence as to what this was for, but a 1950 aerial photo appears to show two small shelters in a clearing at the end of the track. My hunch is that these were picnic or lunch shelters for the public or the staff and patients of the hospital. Who can enlighten me?

Third Cemetery



This is the great view from the gates of the Third Cemetery. The Obelisk marks the last resting space of Private Hector Fraser HICKS who was born on 22 February 1900, enlisted on 9 September 1918 (Australian Commonwealth Military Services). His unit embarked from Sydney on 2 November 1918 on board HMAT A7 Medic but the ship was recalled owing to the signing of Armistice. Hector contracted influenza, was quarantined at Quarantine Station Manly on 25 November and died on 30 November 1918, one of many who died there in November 1918 of pneumonia and were buried in the Third Cemetery...
