Sad News

Sue Halmagyi lost her battle with cancer on 25 June 2013. The Foundation and its Nursery Group offer our condolences to her family. She loved North Head and her presence will be sorely missed. We have all lost a friend.



Taken on 12 February 2009, working to establish our first Nursery Bay which was completed and approved on 27th February, 2009.

Establishing a Nursery at North Head to support The Sydney Harbour Federation Trust, was a dream in 2008, but hard work and dedication with Sue overseeing and enthusing others, meant that the Nursery was up and growing by March 2009.

The main emphasis of Nursery work has been to support the rehabilitation and revegetation of Eastern Suburbs Banksia Scrub at North Head, an endangered ecological community. This is done by replanting previously grassed areas, sometimes close to bushland, thus providing habitat for endangered bandicoot population, birds and other animals.

Sue Halmagyi won the 2013 Manly Environment Centre's Eco-award for her work in the Nursery set up and management. She was proud of her award and has left us her prize- a painting- which is hanging in our new shed.

Oval



We're slowly filling in the Oval surrounds, Sue lead us into this slowly, so we didn't panic and run away. The aim is for a mixture of trees, shrubs and lots of grasses to provide habitat and feeding areas for the endangered bandicoots. In a year or so everyone will be able to appreciate Sue's legacy.
